GENOMIC FINDINGS

Deletion: Exon 19
(Del9/Del12/Del15/Del18/Del21/Del24)

INTERPRETATION

Deletion in exon 19 of EGFR gene is detected.

The genotype calls Exon 19 deletion cover mutation group consisting of Del9, Del12, Del15, Del18, Del21 and Del24. Mutation can be detected for any of these genotype calls, no additional information on the mutant type is provided for this qualitative assay,

For valid batch test results specific controls are being run with every batch.

METHODOLOGY

The Biocartis Idylla™ EGFR Mutation Test is an *in vitro* diagnostic test intended for the qualitative detection of 51 alterations in exon 18 (G719A/C/S), exon 21 (L858R, L861Q), exon 20 (T790M, S768I) mutations, exon 19 deletions and exon 20 insertions in the EGFR oncogene. The Test uses formalin-fixed, paraffin-embedded (FFPE) tissue sections from human non-small cell lung cancer (NSCLC) tissue. A conserved fragment in the transmembrane region of the EGFR gene is amplified simultaneously. This PCR reaction, EGFR total, serves as a sample processing control (SPC) that checks for adequate execution of the complete process from sample to result, and is present in each of the five multiplexes. In addition, the EGFR control reaction is a measure for the amount of amplifiable DNA in the sample and is used in the analysis of the mutation status of the sample. This test is carried out on Idylla platform using the EGFR/1.0 Cartridge based kit which is CE IVD approved.

The Idylla™ EGFR Mutation Test is able to detect allelic frequencies at: ≤ 5% for mutations in exons 19, 20 and 21 of the EGFR oncogene; and ≤ 10% for mutations in exon 18 of the EGFR oncogene
